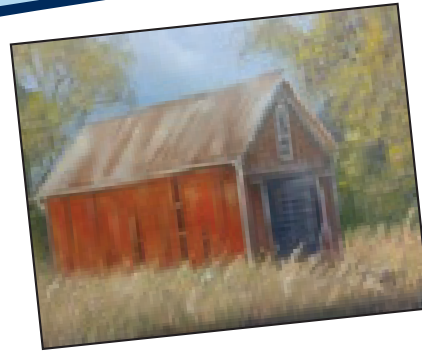

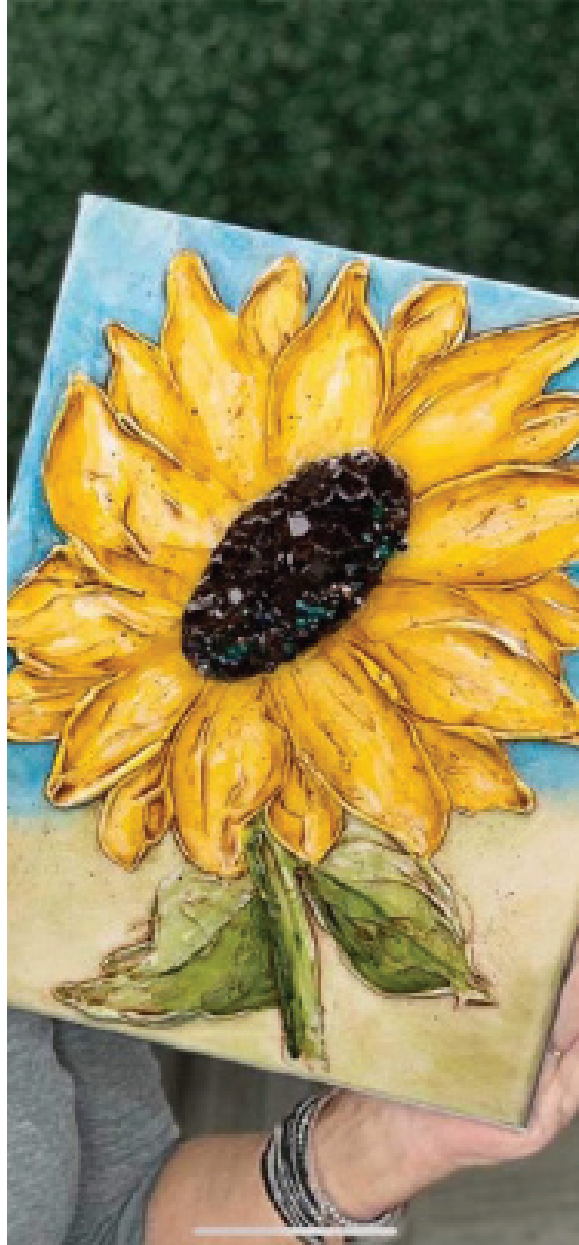

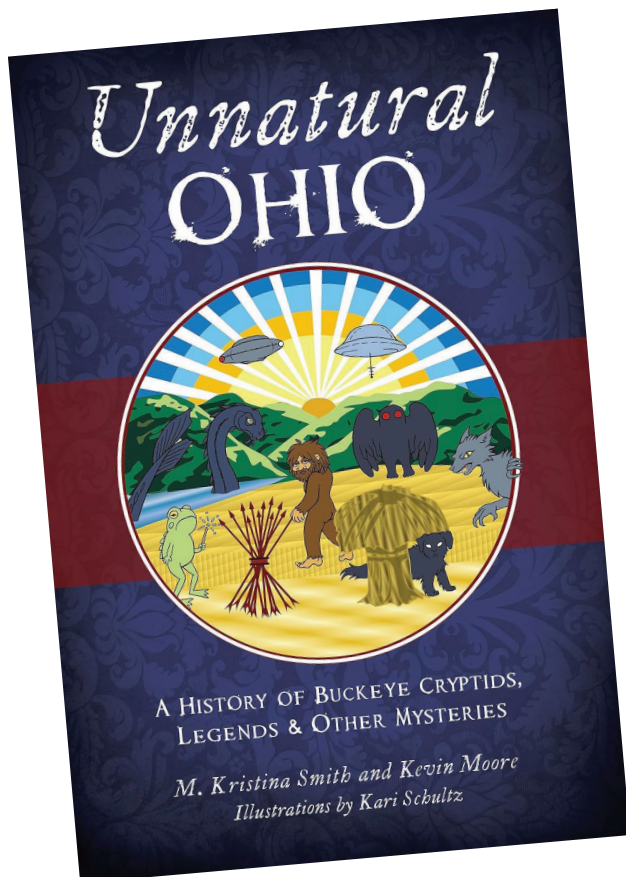

Unnatural Ohio: A History of Buckeye Cryptids, Legends & Other Mysteries

Across city and country, Ohio echoes with tales of creatures, ghosts, and other unexplained phenomena. A monster that appeared to be half man and half dog and wielding a 2-by-4 terrorized a small Northwest Ohio town during the summer of 1972. Over the years, visitors to a quiet Cincinnati suburb claim to have been accosted by a human-size, leathery frogman lurking near the riverbank. For generations, hikers and hunters have reported seeing Bigfoot throughout forests across Ohio, and some of the most notorious and well-documented UFO encounters on record have taken place here. Authors M. Kristina Smith and Kevin Moore parse urban legends from history as they explore the unnatural side of Ohio's heritage. Kevin and Kristina will have books available for purchase at the end of the class.

Facts, Legends, and Lore: The Secrets of Catawba Island

Why is Catawba called an "island" when there is a land connection between it and the mainland? Why is Catawba named after a tribe of indigenous people that never lived in this area? Why are fossils seldom found on Catawba Island? That and other secrets about the southernmost island in the Lake Erie Archipelago will be revealed in an enlightening timeline tale of Catawba's geological birth, prehistoric and Native American people, pioneers, arbor and orchard fame, and transformation to a lakeside recreation mecca.

Biography-Craig S. Koerpel: *Craig Koerpel began summer visits to the Lake Erie Archipelago in 1963. He became a full-time resident of Catawba Island in 2010 upon retiring as Vice President-International of Pittsburgh energy giant CONSOL. Earlier he had worked as a capital campaign director for the country's largest and oldest professional fund-raising counsel, Ketchum Inc. His experience with philanthropic organizations provided a base to serve as founding President of the Catawba Island Historical Society (CIHS). The Society created and has operated Catawba Museum at Union Chapel since 2018. Craig retired as President of the CIHS Board in 2021 but is still an active Trustee with responsibility for much of the research undergirding Museum exhibits and displays. When he is not digging out entertaining and quirky anecdotes about Catawba's past, he is an avid traveler. His sojourns have covered 6 of the 7 continents, all 50 U.S. states, and an even greater number of foreign countries.*

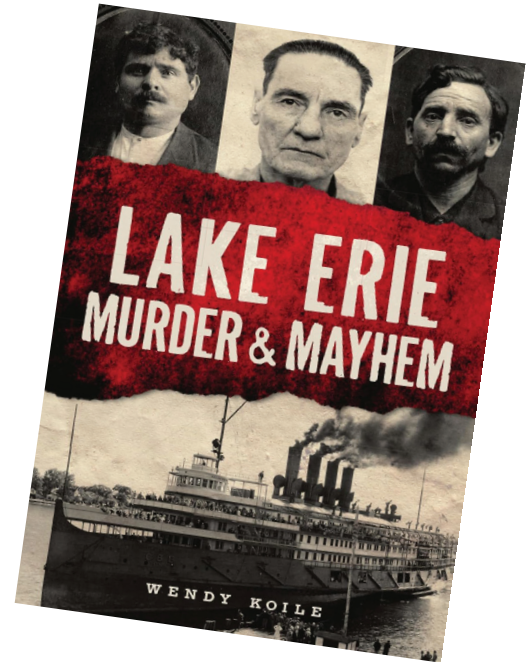

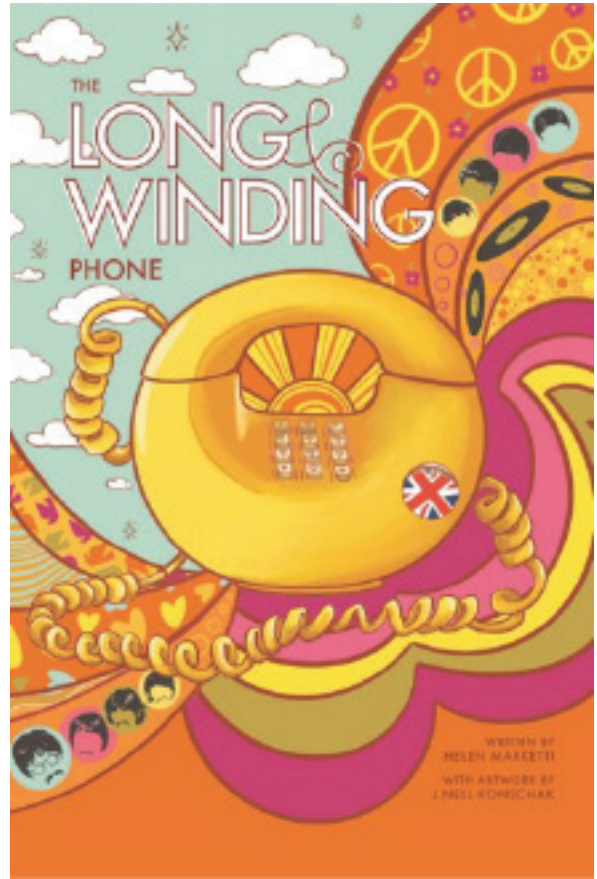
The Long & Winding Phone, by Helen Marketti

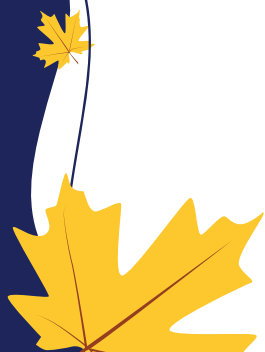

Wrongful Convictions

Your mother's boyfriend tells you that the police are looking for you in connection to a rape. You do not get nervous because you had nothing to do with such a crime. Voluntarily, you go to the police station and provide the detective, who is investigating the rape, a detailed alibi of where you were either night the crime occurred. There was only one problem. You got your weekends confused, and the date of your alibi is wrong. You never leave the police station. You are arrested; several days later, the victim picks you out of a lineup. She identifies you as her attacker at the trial. It takes the jury just 40 minutes to find you guilty and the judge sentences you to life plus 50 years. This is the story of Ronald Cotton. More than 10 years after going to prison at age 22, DNA evidence would show that he was innocent. According to the National Registry of Exonerations, over 3500 people have been exonerated since 1989. Collectively, these people lost more than 31,900 years of their lives for crimes they did not do. This course will examine the problem of wrongful conviction. We will explore the major factors that contribute to people being found guilty of crimes they did not do. We will discuss the ripple effects of wrongful conviction on both the person who was wrongfully incarcerated and on society as a whole.

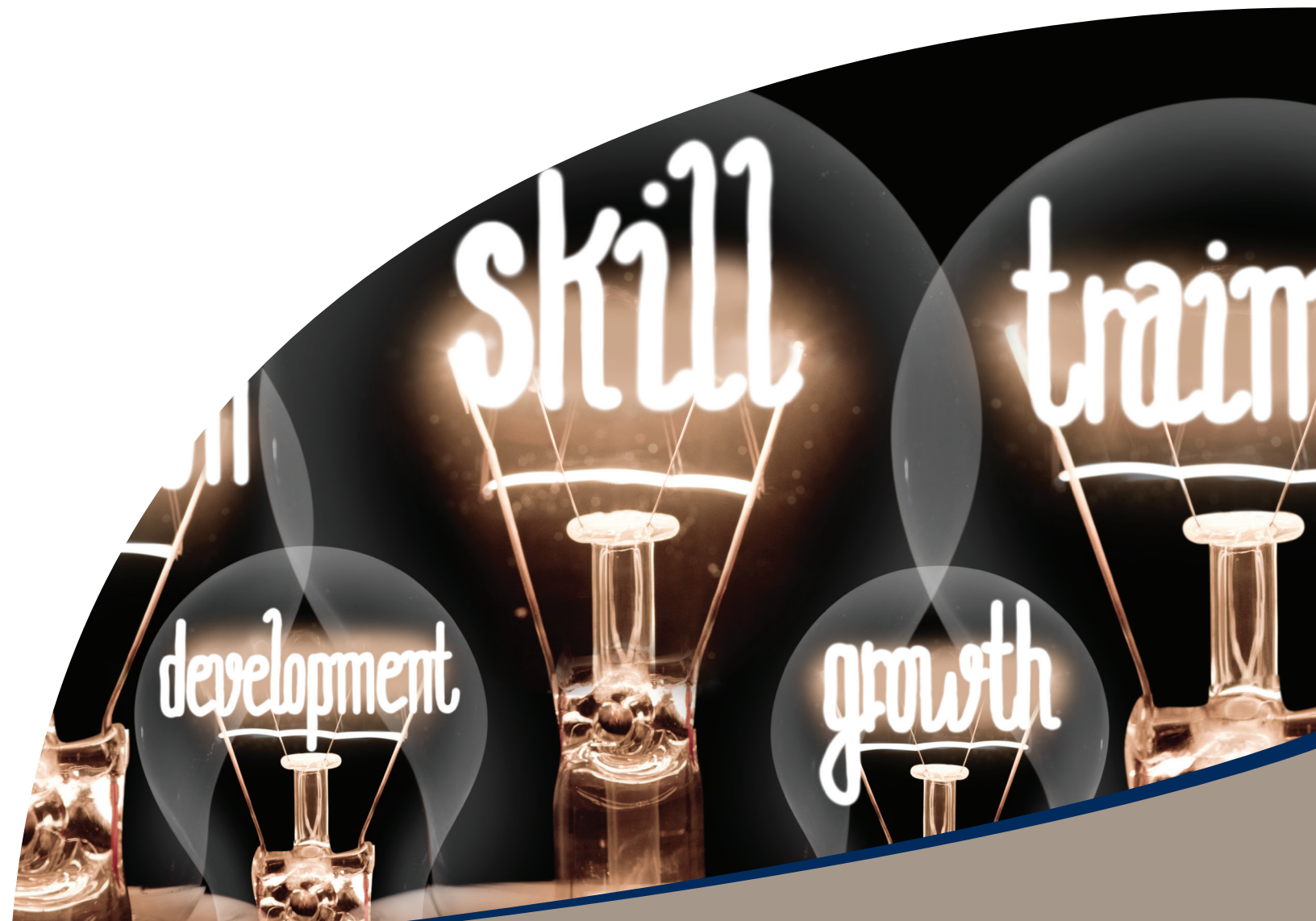
